The Maquiladora program was structured to allow foreign companies, primarily the U.S, to set up a manufacturing operation utilizing tariff agreements between the United States and Mexico. Manufacturing agreements typically consist of a manufacturing plant based in Mexico, usually close to the Mexico-U.S. border, and run by a U.S. company.
